

Current Comcast Areas Where DVRs Support External Hard Drives

UPDATED 5.10.2013

Cisco and Scientific Atlanta branded DVRs already support external hard drives in all Cisco/Scientific-Atlanta areas. Please look for the *Cisco* or *Scientific-Atlanta* label on the front of your Comcast DVR.

For the Cisco RNG 200 and RNG200N you would need to have the traditional "blue" on-screen guide. Most customers with these DVRs do have this guide.

Comcast will be introducing external hard drive support to all remaining areas on an on-going basis through 2013. The external hard drive is required to be connected via the e-SATA port of the DVR.

The following areas where we use **Motorola** branded DVRs now have this feature available:

- Comcast areas of AL, CT, DE, ME, MA, MI, MS, NH, NJ, PA, NY, TN, WV and VT.
- Comcast areas of western OH.
- Most all Comcast areas of Indiana (except for the South Bend area).
- GA: Augusta and Savannah
- LA: Houma

All remaining areas are currently scheduled to have this feature available in 2013. As new areas are announced, we will list them here. Schedules are subject to change.

Upcoming announced locations:

Customers in FL are currently scheduled to have this feature activated the week of June 3.

Customers in DC, MD & VA are currently scheduled to have this feature activated in June.

This feature is currently only available on the DVRs listed below and is not currently compatible with DVRs on the XFINITY TV X1 platform; that DVR includes a 1TB internal hard drive.
